Our Doctor Writes

In Bedwyn we have about a thousand patients signed up for online access to book appointment, look at results and order medication. Only 15% actually actively use it. We will work closely with the patient group to increase online access. So go on – please try it! And if you can't remember your password - please give us a call and we will issue you with a new one.

There are many concerns about the 'Inverse Care Law' as it is known in the NHS. It describes the way that the people who need the care the most tend to get the smallest slice of the NHS cake whilst the middle classes who tend to have a much lower burden of disease, often attract more investment in their health.

A study in the British Journal of General Practice this month looks at the role funding of health services might have on the Inverse Care Law. The study which was carried out in Scotland confirmed that in the most deprived areas consultation rates were 20% higher, and that all cause mortality in those under 75 was 2.4 times greater than the least deprived areas. Patients in the most deprived areas had substantially more illness especially with combined mental and physical ill health.

However funding did not reflect this increased burden of illness - it actually peaked in the most affluent areas and was fairly flat elsewhere. If we want to deliver better health care to those who need it most then the funding mechanisms need to change.

There is widespread concern from GPs across the country that we are at crisis point. Over the last five or six years the share of funding to provide GP services has fallen from 11% of the NHS cake to 7.4%. There is a real problem with recruitment and retention especially in areas of social deprivation and there is talk of a new contract in England. This might help especially if it takes into account the issues about the Inverse Care Law. We are currently in the throws of industrial action from our junior colleagues and I found it desperately saddening that it came to this. A recent poll in Derbyshire showed that 50% of GPs were ready to resign and hand back their practice contracts. I hope that we manage to come to a negotiated settlement so that GPs can receive the resources that they need to deliver the care that our patients need, especially those with the biggest health care problems.

In response to patient feedback we now have another patient line available to contact the Surgery. It is **01672 870050** and if all of our receptionists are busy when you call, you can leave a message for a call back. We prefer the personal touch here at Bedwyn Surgery, and aim to answer all calls as quickly as possible, so generally you will get to speak to someone in person, but patients have expressed an interest in being able to leave a message on occasion which is why we have introduced this option.

We are hoping to organise another Basic Life Support and Defibrillator training session in the early Spring (date to be advised). Please let us know if you would be interested in attending. In the meantime there is a great interactive tool which I would encourage you to have a play with and then bring those skills along to the above session to put into practice.
