Become 'Part Of An Elephant's Future' with Kids Tusk Force

KIDS' TUSK FORCE UK is a new charity based in East Grafton which aims to teach children and young people about the plight of Sub-Saharan elephants due to poaching and the illegal trade in ivory.

It all began after I learnt of the wonderful work of The David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust with orphaned elephants and used their story during our family service at St Nicholas' Church last May. All the children went home with a small block of clay to make a string of beads and paint them with the colours of African animals, together with a label bearing the name of an orphaned elephant. These beads would be a constant reminder of the work of the Trust and of the little elephant they were dedicated to.

The service and the beads had a great impact and so I spoke to more children and made more beads at Sunflowers and Bedwyn Primary School. Kids Tusk Force grew from this with three clear objectives - Conservation, Protection and Education - encouraging schools across the UK to become involved in a crusade led by children to shout out against poaching, the illegal trade in ivory and the protection of habitat. We are partners with the Sheldrick Trust and have been joined by Hugh Fearnley- Whittingstall, Bear Grylls, Jonathan Scott of BBC's Big Cat Diaries, Elinor Goodman and Claire Perry.

Great Bedwyn School have since raised £1,200 and are fostering an elephant for the next ten years and making a substantial donation to the anti-poaching unit. This fantastic effort by Year 5 children (aged 9 and 10 years) is inspirational and they are looking forward to regular progress reports sent from the Keeper's Diaries. Four more schools are embarking on this crusade now with more lined up to go ahead in September.

Our Doctor writes is provided by Sarah Davey who has written about her role as a Care Co-ordinator

"What is a Care Coordinator?" I hear you ask, I will explain.

I provide information and guidance about the care and support that is available to best meet your needs. I can visit you in the comfort of your home and discuss what areas of support or guidance you are looking for. I can help you liaise with or refer you to services with the aim that the support you receive maximises your independence and wellbeing. I can continue to be involved if the support you already have requires adapting to meet your changing needs.

I work alongside the Old School Surgery team and the Community team based at Savernake Hospital. This enables me to refer patients from the surgery into the community team for Physiotherapy / Occupational Therapy and District Nurse services. A simple piece of equipment or adaption provided, following assessment by the community team, may enable a person to continue with a daily activity with which they were struggling, thereby promoting safety and independence.

I liaise with the acute hospitals and follow referrals from the ward to the community teams to support in hospital discharge. Leaving hospital and settling back home can be a worrying and exhausting time. The Care Coordinator is an effective link in promoting joined up care and reassurance to the person leaving hospital that the care and support they need will be in place when they return home.

I make referrals to the Adult Social Care team based at the local council. This team helps people who are in need of practical support due to illness, disability, old age or a low income and provide many avenues of support especially with housing, finances and wellbeing. Many voluntary/charity organisations work closely with the council and are vital in providing support. I can provide information about these organisations and help you access them.

I help with the completion of application forms, such as the Blue Badge, Attendance Allowance and benefit forms. A Blue Badge can allow closer parking to amenities, enabling continuation of access to the community and services, which in turn promotes social inclusion and wellbeing. The Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people over 65 who may need to pay for extra help to stay independent at home.

Local events and news in brief

Planning applications for tree work in our Parish conservation area

Consent is needed before any work is carried out on protected trees, except in cases where the tree is dead or dangerous. When permission is granted for the felling of a tree, a replanting condition may be appropriate to make sure the tree is replaced with the same or a similar species. The tree preservation order (TPO) then automatically applies to the new tree. Anyone wishing to carry out work on trees over 75mm in diameter within a conservation area will need to give the council six weeks' notice of their intention. This ensures the council can make a TPO where necessary. You can use www.wiltshirecouncil.maps.arcgis.com mapping system to check if the tree is within a conservation area or covered by a Tree Preservation Order. Planning application forms and guidance can be downloaded from the pack finder page. - See more at: www.wiltshire.gov.uk/planning-trees-hedges

Prosecution for unauthorised works to trees can lead to a maximum fine of £20,000 or twice the value of the tree. Certain trees are exempt from felling licensing such as garden or fruit trees, trees under eight centimetres in diameter and trees that are either dead or dangerous.

40mph speed limits confirmed in Marten and came into operation on 29th May 2017

1. THE COUNTY OF WILTSHIRE (C195, MARTEN, GRAFTON) (40MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2017

To introduce a 40mph speed limit on the following length of road: C195, Marten, Grafton – from a point 163 metres south east of its junction with A338 to a point in line with the boundary of property known as No. 4 Armines

2. THE COUNTY OF WILTSHIRE (C195, MARTEN, GRAFTON) (50MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2017

To introduce a 50mph speed limit on the following length of road: C195, Marten, Grafton – from its junction with A338 for a distance of 163 metres in a south easterly direction

Speed Limits & Speed watch

Grafton Parish Council has been working hard to highlight speeding through our villages and have recently been successful in securing a 40mph speed limit through Marten. Along with this, regular speed watch sessions are held in the village through the 30mph section on the A338. We have a team of volunteers who help this effort, but we are always looking for more.
